DAY 1 – SIX FLAGS + HORROR FESTIVAL (31 OCTOBER).

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DAY 3 – AMEALCO + GUANAJUATO (2 NOVEMBER).

We will head to **Amealco de Bonfil** to take part in a **workshop on making the Lele doll**, an experience where living heritage, Otomí craftsmanship and hands-on learning come together. Under the guidance of local craftspeople, we will learn about the cultural significance of the doll and the basic steps involved in making it, whilst appreciating the value of craftsmanship and community identity.

We will then head to **Guanajuato**, where we will enjoy a sensational '**callejoneada**' led by the **student band** – an experience where **traditional music**, urban history and social interaction come together in the heart of the historic centre. Through a night-time tour of the city's alleyways, squares and iconic spots, we will experience the city as a living stage, gaining an understanding of how popular culture shapes identity and collective memory.

DAY 4 – GUANAJUATO (3 NOVEMBER).

After breakfast, we set off to visit the capital's most iconic sights.

- **La Valenciana Mine:** We'll descend into what were once the tunnels of one of the city's most iconic mines.
- **La Hacienda del Cochoero**, to see the instruments of torture, catacombs and corridors of the old hacienda.
- **The University's monumental** stone staircase, carved from local quarry stone, is a stunning feat of architecture.
- **The Historic Centre**, a UNESCO World Heritage Site.
- **Guanajuato Cathedral**, dedicated to Our Lady of Guadalupe.
- **The Juárez Theatre**, a magnificent work of art which still hosts the Cervantino Festival on its stage every year.
- **Jardín Unión.**
- **Callejón del Beso**, where you can learn about the tragic legend of a couple in love, which today forms part of the city's cultural heritage.
- **The mummies of Guanajuato:** to understand the phenomenon of natural mummification and its social context.
- **The Pípila Monument:** an iconic viewpoint where history, identity and the urban landscape converge.

DAY 5 – ZACATECAS (4 NOVEMBER).

After breakfast at the hotel, we set off for the **El Edén Mine**, a place where mining **history, geology and industrial heritage** come together. On this tour, we will learn about the mine as a key part of the city's origins and development, gaining an understanding of how mineral extraction transformed the landscape, the economy and everyday life in Zacatecas.

Next, we will visit **Cerro de la Bufa**, an iconic site where landscape, history and heritage come together. On this tour, we will explore the hill as a natural viewpoint and a key landmark in the city's history, from where it is possible to take in the urban layout, the mining landscape and the main landmarks of the Historic Centre.

DAY 6 – ZACATECAS (5 NOVEMBER).

We will head to the **La Quemada Archaeological Site**, a place where **pre-Hispanic architecture**, landscape and social organisation come together. On this tour, we will explore the settlement as a heritage site and examine its main structures to understand how a city in northern Mesoamerica adapted to its environment, and what theories exist regarding its role in regional trade networks and control.

We will head to **El Malpaso** for a culinary experience where tradition, local identity and community life come together: a **tasting of the area's traditional chorizo tortas**. This activity aims to introduce the group to a flavour that is representative of the region and to help them understand how a dish can tell the story of local craftsmanship and the local economy.

Later, we will head to **the Francisco Goitia Museum**, a space where art, regional history and cultural life come together. On this tour, we will discover the museum as a living heritage site and explore its galleries to understand how Goitia's work and the associated collections engage with themes such as **identity, landscape, conflict, humanity and memory**.

DAY 7 – TAMASOPO + PUENTE DE DIOS (6 NOVEMBER).

After breakfast at the hotel, we set off for **Las Cascadas de Tamasopo**, a series of waterfalls surrounded by natural pools, ideal for swimming and enjoying the sound of the water cascading through the jungle.

Later, we'll visit **Puente de Dios**, a site featuring turquoise pools, waterfalls and caves where water, light and rock combine to create a unique landscape. The setting allows us to combine hydrology, geology and river biodiversity with responsible tourism practices in a natural area of outstanding scenic beauty.

DAY 8 – TAMUL (7 NOVEMBER).

After breakfast at the hotel, we set off to visit the **Tamul Waterfall**, considered the largest and most majestic in the Huasteca Potosina, with a drop of over 100 metres into the River Santa María. Its awe-inspiring natural beauty makes it one of the region's main ecotourism attractions.

During the visit, the students will take a trip in pangas (traditional wooden boats) along the Tampoán River, enjoying unique scenery amongst canyons and turquoise waters, until they reach the waterfall's natural viewpoint. The activity will help to reinforce values of integration and teamwork, as the journey requires coordinated rowing. On the way back along the river, we will stop for a swim in the **Edén grotto**.

DAY 9 – WATERFALL JUMPING AT EL NARANJO (8 NOVEMBER).

After breakfast at the hotel, we'll head to the **village of El Naranjo** to visit the extraordinary **El Meco waterfall**, where we'll board a raft and paddle out to this stunning waterfall to jump into the water; we'll take a few jumps from the rocks to enjoy a day full of adventure.

Afterwards, we'll head to another extraordinary spot in the Huasteca region called **La Playita**, where we'll continue swimming in the natural pools.

After breakfast at the hotel, we'll head to the village and **Micos River**, where we'll go on a fantastic hike along the riverbed; we'll have the chance to admire the vegetation in all its splendour, swim in crystal-clear water and jump into the waterfalls that form some of the most beautiful cascades in the Huasteca. Afterwards, we'll have time to enjoy regional dishes at the

Micos tourist rest stop; we'll spend the rest of the afternoon swimming in the river, taking photographs and shopping for handicrafts.

DAY 11 – SAN MIGUEL DE ALLENDE (10 NOVEMBER).

After finishing our breakfast, we'll head to the town of **San Miguel de Allende**, where we'll set off on a fun treasure hunt around San Miguel to find all the clues and win a fantastic prize, visiting: The Parish **Church of San Miguel Arcángel**, which is the city's iconic landmark with its extraordinary construction history: when master **mason Zeferino Gutiérrez** was commissioned to create a new façade, he drew inspiration for his design from drawings, engravings and postcards of European cathedrals; our tour continues at the **Casa de Allende Museum**, an 18th-century two-storey Baroque building which, with its intricate stonework and wrought iron, is a magnificent example of the houses built by the wealthy Spanish nobility; **The Casa del Mayorazgo de la Canal**, which is undoubtedly the most important residential house in San Miguel. The Ignacio Ramírez '**El Nigromante**' Cultural Centre and the **Ángela Peralta Theatre**, where we can admire their ornate façades and interiors; winding our way through the surrounding streets, we'll reach **the Church of San Francisco** (formerly the Convent of San Antonio de Padua), whose façade is a striking feature of the church. We'll enjoy some **San Agustín churros** opposite the church before continuing with the tour. **The Toy Museum**, where we'll see toys that are sometimes simple, sometimes not so simple, but all of them with one thing in common: creativity.

DAY 12 – HIDALGO (11 NOVEMBER).

We will head to the former **Santa María Regla Hacienda**, a place where **history, architecture and industrial heritage** come together. On this tour, we will explore the hacienda as a testament to the region's mining past and to the production systems that shaped the economic and social life of Hidalgo.

Next, we will visit the **Basalt Prisms**, volcanic rock formations that are remarkable for their hexagonal columns, created by nature millions of years ago. This experience will provide an opportunity to reflect on the interplay between cultural and natural heritage, linking mining history with geology and environmental conservation.

Later, we will head to the village of **Real del Monte**, where we can take local transport to visit the **Acosta Mine**, one of Real del Monte's most iconic sites, which preserves over 300 years of mining history. It currently serves as a site museum and cultural centre, where visitors can learn about the development of mining from the colonial era through to the 20th century.

To round off the tour, we will visit the **Mina de la Dificultad**, an iconic site in Real del Monte that forms part of the region's mining heritage. Built in the 19th century, this mine was one of the most influential in silver production and now operates as a

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site museum, preserving its original architecture and machinery. During the tour, students will visit the impressive engine house, which still houses large-scale equipment used in mineral extraction, and explore exhibitions displaying documents, tools and testimonies about the miners' lives. The visit will provide an opportunity to reflect on the evolution of mining, its contributions to economic development and the social challenges associated with this activity.
